
### THE COROMANDEL'S GOLD HERITAGE

A former gold mining boom town that once produced gold by the tonne, Thames has proudly maintained its heritage buildings and has an operational gold stamper battery and original tunnels which now exist only to preserve a fascinating insight to the past. Thames had a small beginning with the first offical strike of gold in June 1867. The 'big bonanza' was between 1869 and 1871. In 1871 the top producing Caledonian Mine turned out 361,581 ounces - more than 10 tonnes - with a total value of about \$1,950,000.



With the invention of the cyanide process, making mining profitable, the town boomed. It was a tough life for miners, and the strikes in 1912 were a major political event.



# THE COROMANDEL'S GOLD HERITAGE

For centuries Māori travelled the Waihou River to reach Ōhinemuri, and Europeans were quick to develop this waterway with the opening of the Ōhinemuri goldfield in 1875. By the 1880s small paddle steamers were running up the river as far as Paeroa, as gold attracted people, shipping and investment.
